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Tour Classifications

Long before credit cards and money-sending cell phone apps like Venmo, transactions were made using durable and tangible coins. Coins were the medium of trade in many communities, and minting of coins often sprang up in the absence of coins being readily available on the frontier. Metals had their relative value, of course, and so our metal markers here will indicate how much a tour or overnight will affect your coin purse of today.



Copper Penny

\$30-\$175

For some copper pennies, we'll get you out and about for a single day. These include walking tours, day hikes, our standard five-hour bus tours and simple caravan tours. Meals will generally be on your own.



Silver Eagle

\$200-\$2,500

Soar in with some silver eagles, and we'll sail away with you for shorter overnights and some more expensive specialized adventures. These include overnights of two to four days and customized and novel outings, such as tastings and culinary tours.



Gold Doubloon

\$2,500-\$7,500

Time to crack open your secret pirate stash for high adventure. These signature sojourns include overnights of five or more days, as well as high-end luxury and overnight tours.

TOUR DIFFICULTY SCALE:

EASY

May involve short periods of standing and limited stairs. Usually walking tours consisting of no more than two miles roundtrip, or day bus tours.

MODERATE

May include walking more than two miles roundtrip on easy trails or streets, climbing stairs and spending several hours outdoors. These can also be longer bus tours.

BOLD

May involve one or more nights away from home and days with numerous activities. Longer periods of standing, sitting and walking more than two miles roundtrip on streets and moderate trails, climbing stairs and spending several hours outdoors. Overnight trips, hikes and longer bus tours.

CHALLENGING

For the adventurer! Requires a high level of fitness. Usually hikes on rough terrain and adventurous activities, such as canoeing or rafting, accessing remote areas by foot, vehicle or boat and extended periods of being outdoors.

POLICIES

REGISTRATION & PAYMENT

To register for a tour, please visit <u>TreasureBoxTours.com/group-tours</u>. Unless otherwise indicated, all registration deadlines are within the 2024 calendar year.

All day tours require payment in full, due at the time of booking online. Add the tour and quantity to your cart, click the cart icon in the upper right corner of the screen, then complete your purchase at checkout. You may register for multiple tours with one checkout.

Overnight tours require a 10% deposit of the total tour cost at the time of booking. The remaining balance will be split, with 50% of the remaining balance due on the registration deadline. Final balance due fourteen days prior to tour start date. You will receive notifications from Treasure Box Tours via email.

All prices for overnight tours are based on double occupancy. Should there be only one occupant to a room, the single-occupancy rate will be applied. Roommates may be requested but are not guaranteed. If paired with a roommate, you will be notified and given information to get in touch prior to the tour. If paired with a roommate that cancels after the registration deadline, you will not be assessed the single-occupancy rate.

To request a roommate, register with single occupancy online and click the checkbox on the form "Roommate Requested." Should you be paired with a roommate, your remaining balance will be adjusted, and you will receive an updated invoice.

CANCELLATION POLICY

You may cancel a day tour seven or more days prior to the tour and receive a full refund or credit. Cancellations with fewer than seven days' notice are non-refundable.

You may cancel an overnight tour without any penalty before the registration deadline posted for each tour. Any deposits taken before the registration deadline will be refunded in full. If canceled 60-45 days before the tour, 75% refundable; 44-30 days, 50% refundable; 29-14 days before the tour, 25% refundable. Cancellations thirteen days or fewer prior to the tour are non-refundable.

WAITLISTS

Tours may sell out fast! There is limited capacity on each tour so that we may safely conduct tours and accommodate a safe journey and experience for each guest.

Should a tour sell out, you may request to be put on the waitlist via the website. Should a space open up, you will be notified and given the opportunity to register for the tour. This will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

Should a waitlist be large enough, we may be able to put together a second date for that tour. You will be notified and given the opportunity to register for the tour.

START LOCATIONS

For any registered tours, guests will receive information via a tour letter, which will include the important details for the tour, including the start location. Most walking tours will start within the neighborhood or area of touring. For most of our bus tours, we have partnered with the Springhill Suites by Marriott Denver Downtown for a central start location. There is a parking garage at the hotel, charging a daily fee. The amount will be listed in the tour letter. All overnight tours list the start location/city, as some trips do not start in Colorado. For more information, visit our website.

Please note that all overnight tour itineraries are subject to change. Final itineraries are sent to registered guests 2-4 weeks prior to the start of a tour. Day tour participants will receive a tour letter with a brief itinerary 1-2 weeks prior to the start of a tour.




DISCOVERING BASELINE ROAD




BOULDER MUSEUM SAMPLER






THE CRITTERS OF COLORADO
